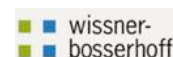

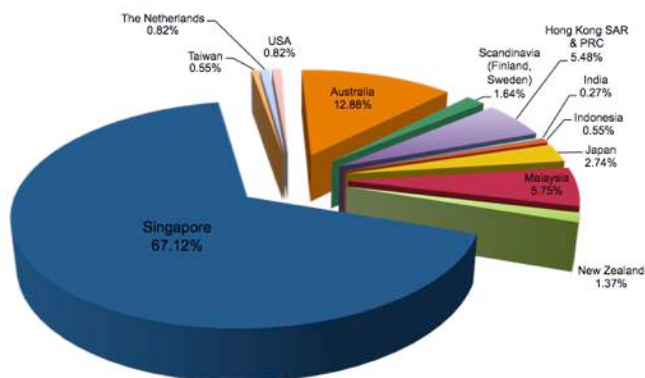

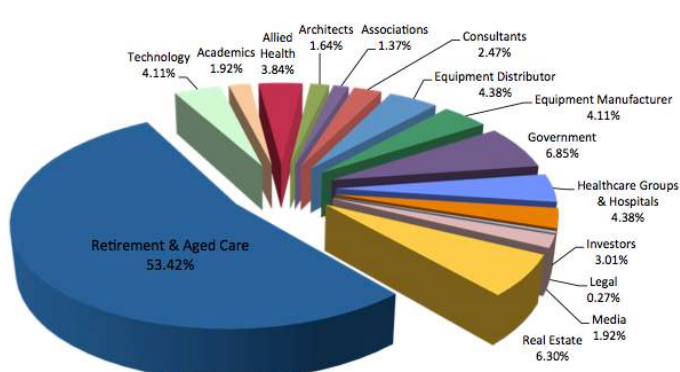
AAIF2014 KEY FACTS & FIGURES
